	Seismic Surveys	A concern was raised with respect to Geophysical surveys not being allowed in Z1 following the summary of the group work discussions. This becomes a concern as Seychelles is carrying out international negotiations to claim extended shelves and under the Law of the Sea, Seychelles (PetroSeychelles) is currently determining sedimentary thickness in some areas currently in Z1. Seychelles is trying to acquire seismic in this area to claim this area (near Aldabra; area 15). There is also a plan to link Mozambique, Comoros and neighboring countries to determine geophysical connectivity. However once the study reaches a Z1 means no seismic data in this area. Also applies to link of Madagascar shelf and Seychelles (area 13) and Mascarene plateau (Area 5).	With previous meetings seismic was allowable in Z1 with C 1,3,8. All comments in tables will need to be compiled and note changes from Version 4. J.S. Members from the group that worked on Area 5, 15 and 16 agreed that if there are other national ongoing projects there is no objection to change it to conditional. A.L.

Area-based Management Considerations - TWG7 (16 May 2017) Comments and Revisions in red font

- Spear fishing is not permitted in Seychelles
- Navigational laws and right-of-way must be observed in all zones and areas
- Fisheries Act protects all marine mammals
- The Seychelles EEZ falls within the ICRW Indian Ocean Whale Sanctuary
- The Wild Animals and Birds Protection Act protects all marine turtles and whale sharks
- The Demersal Fisheries Management Plan for the Mahe Plateau is being finalised
- Protected Areas Legislation is being finalised
- Semi-industrial longline should not be allowed to fish in depths less than 200 m
- Is popping a management consideration?
- Seabed mining is governed by the International Seabed Authority (ISA)
- Shipping is governed by the International Maritime Organisation (IMO)
- More detailed management plans will define conditions
- Popping banned
- Management plans are not currently required for Petroleum Exploration, only for Development
- Seychelles-flagged purse seiners that are operated by EU fishing vessels must comply with all Seychelles laws, regulations and policies, and subject to same management considerations as vessels operated by Seychelles nationals
- Foreign-flagged purse seine vessels operated by foreign fishing vessels in the EU must comply with specifications in the EU-Seychelles Fisheries Partnership Agreement, expires 2020
