## Financing options and management models to implement 400,000 km<sup>2</sup> of new marine protections in Seychelles

Seychelles has committed to expand marine protection to 30% of its waters by 2020. It is developing a comprehensive Marine Spatial Plan (MSP) to meet this commitment as well as address climate change and support the Blue Economy. Seychelles is about half way through the planning process and is starting to gather information to determine the components, costs, financing options and management models to implement 400,000 km² of new marine protections identified through a participatory stakeholder process.

This is where we need you – your experience and expertise! We are aiming to gather information and examples for the costing, management models and long-term financing of large scale marine protected areas (MPA) – areas greater than 150,000 sq. km. These MPAs can range from no-take marine reserves to sustainable use areas for biodiversity, unique species or habitats. If you have documentation that can be shared with others, please would you add it to these folders? We would like to be able to share information with other countries following a similar process to Seychelles.
