The focus of each consultation is tailored to meet different stakeholder needs and availability. The fishery landing Q&A sessions are aimed at engaging with local fishers operating out of Mahe who are unable to attend a full-day workshop. The public information clinic allows for any stakeholder to drop-in and discuss the sustainable use area planning process or get more information on the sustainable use areas and the SMSP.

Each planning workshop will be focused on one of the sustainable use areas and will be interactive full days with participatory sessions for sharing of local knowledge and expertise. These sessions will be critically important to guide the development of the management plans. Background materials will be provided to participants before the workshops so that they have enough time to consult with their constituents/colleagues and prepare for the discussions.
