The meeting was called by the department for tourism and consisted mostly of representatives operating in the inner islands. This was the consideration of C21 – for dive sites. During the meeting, maps were presented of dive sites in the inner island. SMSP queried committee members on whether similar maps exist for the outer islands.   |   |

Under the GoS-UNDP-GEF OI project, they are not permitted at Desroches, Poivre, Alphonse and Farquhar following extensive stakeholder discussion.
